
We recently decided that it was the right moment for us to become a member of the Staffordshire Chambers of Commerce. The decision was made as we see that a strong link

They looked in showrooms and worked to a budget. It's taken many months but has been a brilliant learning experience for them all. Residents, members of the community and families were invited to view the work and talk to the young people about their project. The evening, also supported by local County Councillor Maureen Compton and members of the Stafford Knot Rotary club, was a great success and the young people showed immense pride in their achievements.
